1 THIS WEEK'S SERVICE

THIS SUNDAY we start a new series, **Built** *Different*, going through 1 Thessalonians. Paul writes to people who welcomed the message of hope in Jesus in the midst of suffering. And yet they continue on, as evidenced by their increasing faith, deepening love and strengthening resolve. *How?* They refused to be shaped by the world's story and culture in order to embrace God's story and the new world He makes among us through Christ. Paul writes with joy, encouragement but also challenge – all messages we need – so that followers of Jesus might be equipped for the road ahead pursuing a life of closeness to Jesus that's built *different*.

The message this Sunday will focus on 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10, "Thank God for All of You."
