WELCOME & HOSPITALITY MINISTRY

Greeters: Greeters are the first impression for every guest, and this impression sets the stage for people to be open to life change. Greeters inform newcomers where washrooms, ministries, and the Welcome Booth are located.

Total time investment for one year: approx. half an hour before the start of each service 4-6 times per year.

Ushers: Ushers are to receive everyone with a smile, a word of welcome, a loving touch (such as a handshake) and a worship guide on their way in to the sanctuary. In the event of a full capacity service, they assist in seating the attendee to an open seat.

Total time investment for one year: approx. half an hour before the start of each service, and availability during the service. Serving ???times/year

Coffee Service: Coffee service volunteers are asked to start the coffee before the service, set up and serve coffee and clean up after the service. You are welcome to volunteer as a family or as an individual. There is not a membership requirement, coffee service is an excellent way for new people to connect to Bethel. *Total time investment for one year: approx.*

1.25-hour commitment once every 4-6 months. 30 minutes set up and 45 minutes clean up.

CHURCHWIDE MINISTRY

Dove Taekwondo: Taekwondo is the medium that allows us to share the love of Christ with kids and adults from the church and community. Kids Club leader: Kids Club is a place where kids (ages 4-16) can play and connect. As volunteer you are simply asked to engage with the kids in games, crafts, or just lending an ear. Kids Club runs every Thursday night from 6:30pm to 8:00 pm at the Clareview II drop-in center. Volunteers can commit to a monthly, bi-monthly, or continuing basis.

This is a safe and secure method of outreach, prayer, and discipleship that blesses inmates and volunteers alike. *Total time investment: commit to a two-hour time slot each week (calls are max. 20 min. each).*

Refugee Committee: This team works under the Deacons to administer the sponsorship and then subsequent care of refugees coming to our community. We work closely with World Renew, our denominational agency, which is a sponsorship agreement holder with the Canadian government. WORSHIP

Sound Operators: Oversee audio production during weekend services, work closely with the band to set up the stage adequately, ensure that communication from the platform happens effectively. *Total time investment: 8 hours per week, 1 weekend per month.*

Musicians: Adequately and skillfully prepare music for weekend services. This includes personal practice time, rehearsals, and sound checks. They will work with worship leaders to guide the congregation in worship through music.

Vocalist: Vocalists sing on our worship teams on Sundays and help lead worship. There is a practice on Thursday evening which they are required to attend. Vocalists must be able to sing harmonies. *Total time investment: 5 hours per month.*

Worship Leaders / Service Planners: Oversee service planning in conjunction with the preaching pastor and worship arts team. They are responsible for selecting songs, scripture passages, rehearsing with music team and leading the music portion of the weekend services. *Total time investment: 12 hours per week, 1 weekend per month.*

Worship Arts Team: Work with preaching pastors to add creative value to weekend services and oversee stage design aesthetics in a way that is conducive to helping people worship.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES

Cadets: Cadets is a place where boys (grade 2-6) can be mentored and have fun building a variety of skills and developing faithful, Christlike attitudes in their lives. They meet every second Tuesday night from September to May at 7:00-8:30 p.m.

Total time investment for one year: approx. 36 hours, plus a weekend campout in the spring.

GEMS: GEMS (Girls Everywhere Meeting the Savior) is for girls (grade 2– 9) to discover who they are and who God created them to be through fun, fellowship, and building skills together. They meet every other Tuesday night from September to May at 7:00-8:30 p.m.

Total time investment for one year: approx. 36 hours.

Bethel Kids Large Group: Children aged 3– grade 4 are welcomed into our large group space to explore God's Big Story together through worship, prayer, and story time. Large group runs about 15-20 minutes and is led by the storyteller. Story tellers usually serve once per month. *Total time investment for one year: approx. 15 hours.*

Bethel Kids Small Groups: After the large group session, children break off into separate age groups to explore the week's story through games, crafts, activities, and discussions.

Leaders serve for a month at a time and alternate every other month.

Grades 5 & 6: Using a program called Dive, students and their leaders explore Bible stories paired with important teachings from the Reformed/Presbyterian confessions. This guides students into deeper discussions and more complex concepts as they study God's Word. Leaders usually serve once per month. *Total time investment for one year: approx. 20 hours.*

Security: Our children's area is kept safe by security personnel who do head counts, monitor children as they attend classes, ensure kids are safe in the washrooms, and call for parents if a child is upset. Security personnel serve approximately once per month.

Family Faith Ministries: hosts workshops, seminars, and training sessions throughout the year, equipping families to grow and build lasting faith together. Volunteers assist with



planning and preparing meals and snacks for the events, as well as help with set up and clean up on the day. *Time commitment: approximately 5-10 hours, twice per year.*

Bethel Kids Check-In: Each Sunday, families sign in their children in at the computer check-in kiosk. Greeters ensure each family is checked in and welcome visitors and new families, inputting data into the system. Greeters serve for approximately 30 minutes before the start of the service once per month from September to June.

Nursery Childcare Providers: Each Sunday, babies aged 0-2 years old are welcomed into the nursery by caring adults who create a safe, comfortable place for Bethel's youngest attendees to play and explore. Childcare providers serve approximately once per month from September to June.

YOUTH

Youth Leader: Youth Leaders engage with a small group of students and mentor them to “become like Christ and share Him with others”. This is done through connecting with youth at *Paul and Pancakes* (monthly Sunday Bible-study), events (monthly or bi-monthly on Fridays or Sundays), or retreats. Youth Leaders are also expected to further build relationships with students through meetings outside of these events. If you have a love for youth and want to see them fall in love with Jesus, then this may be the role for you.

Total time investment: 3-4 hours per week for three weeks a month (for Catalyst Bible study, and for youth events) throughout the school year. Additional time investment includes youth retreats twice a year in winter and spring.

Paul and Pancakes Volunteer: Bethel Youth hosts a monthly Sunday Bible study called “Paul and Pancakes”, which involves making pancakes together before studying a letter Paul wrote to the early church. This volunteer opportunity involves engaging with students while making pancakes.

Governing Elders

Governing Elders are called to provide oversight to the congregation by:

- Maintaining doctrinal and moral integrity within the church and exercising discipline and mutual censure as required.
- Praying faithfully for Bethel Church ministries and staff.
- Participating in council meetings and attending congregational meetings.
- Giving visionary leadership, developing with staff a long-range plan of ministry and holding each other accountable for the mission, vision and values of the church.
- Yearly reviewing the organizational structures and make recommendations to council for changes.
- Dealing with legal or government matters.
- Overseeing ministry staff through:
 - Monthly staff reports and annual reviews
 - Approving all staff and pastor task descriptions
 - Reviewing and making changes in staff ministry descriptions/profiles to Council when needed
 - The hiring and releasing of non-pastoral staff
 - Appointing search committees for Pastors or occasionally for new staff members
- *Overseeing the nomination process for office bearers*
- *Being responsible for all financial matters*
- *Setting agendas for council meetings and congregational meetings*
- *Reviewing all policies and recommending changes to council*
- *Promoting a safe environment for all people, with fair means and processes for addressing abuse*
- *Appointing delegates to Classis*
- *Regularly informing the congregation of its actions*
