1 THIS WEEK'S SERVICE

This Sunday we continue our series through 1 Thessalonians, *Built Different*, by reflecting on how connected our world is and what this means for faithfully following Jesus. Though Paul is writing from afar, he is deeply interested in his fellow believers, so much so, that his own faith aligns with their own journey. How they experience provision, blessing, even how they respond in suffering, impacts Paul's own life. With great care and concern, he sent Timothy to check in with them; what he heard back was extremely encouraging. This models for us how connected we are called to be as followers of Jesus. The church is one community and one body under Christ (1 Corinthians 12:27). In our seemingly compartmentalized world, it is tempting to approach life and faith on our own. Paul and the church among the Thessalonians remind and challenge us—this is not the way. Instead, they prompt us to intentionally care for one another and tap into our interconnectedness as a source of strength and encouragement.

The message this Sunday will focus on 1 Thessalonians 3, "Faith in a Connected World."

BETHEL IN THE NEW YEAR: In 2024, we want to grow closer with God. In our series, *Built Different*, we are learning what it means to:

Consecrate – What does God desire that I lay at His feet? How do I make this part of my life holy, repenting what I have wrong in my life?

Commune – How does the Lord desire me to connect with Him and other people? I get to be with God in my life; how can I listen to God more?

Contend- How does God want me to fight for His goodness in this world? How does God want me to use my place, authority, and influence to advocate for the good in this world to bring about His Kingdom?

At Bethel we want to be intentional about applying these concepts in our lives personal and communally. Some ways to do this are through our Scripture Reading Plan or by joining one of the upcoming courses on Emotionally Healthy Relationships and Personal Financial Management. These are often areas in our lives that we need to consecrate to the Lord. Participating in the Scripture reading plan or attending one of these courses can help in communing with God as you learn and listen to what He wants for you in these areas. Allowing God to transform these areas of your life you will be better prepared to contend for His Kingdom right where He has placed you!
