1 THIS WEEK'S SERVICE

This Sunday we continue our sermon series, *Cross Through the Cliché*, where we are reflecting on misunderstood sayings about faith from the Bible and culture. Along the way, we will access helpful tools for stepping into a deeper life with Jesus and moving past the cliché to embrace God's heart for us through his word.

Sunday, we will look at Philippians 4:10-13, paying special attention to verse 13 which says, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." In his letter to the Philippian church which Paul is writing from prison, he wants to thank the church for the gifts they had sent to him. He uses this opportunity to encourage the Philippians who are suffering persecution, to remind them to be unified, and to warn against false doctrines. When Paul reminds the Philippian church that "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" what does this refer to? Are all things truly in our grasp?
