God's rescue begins with the birth of Christ and ultimately resolves with his return. Look anywhere in the world today and you will see how far broken our world truly is—the earth cries out in pain as a result of sin. Yet God does not leave us in brokenness, He gives us hope through his birth – the promise that all suffering will come an end. We look back where this brokenness began so that we can behold Christ and become the people God created us to be. Let us join together in our longing for Jesus to come.
